Problem 1 [30 points]:
Each of the following problems is worth 6 points.
1a) [6] Find the inverse Laplace transform of

$$
F(s)=\frac{s-1}{s^{2}+s+1} .
$$

1b) [6] Compute the convolution of $f(t)=t$ and $g(t)=t^{2}$.

1c) [6] Find the Laplace transform of the function

$$
f(t)= \begin{cases}2 & 0 \leq t<2 \\ -1 & 2 \leq t<3 \\ 0 & 3 \leq t\end{cases}
$$

1d) [6] Place a condition on the value of $k$ such that the solution of

$$
3 y^{\prime \prime}+2 y^{\prime}+k y=0
$$

exhibits oscillations.

1e) [6] Find all values of $\alpha$ such that the system

$$
\frac{d \vec{x}}{d t}=\left[\begin{array}{cc}
-2 & 0 \\
\alpha & -2
\end{array}\right] \vec{x}
$$

has a solution of the form $\vec{x}(t)=C_{1} \vec{v}_{1} e^{-2 t}+C_{2}\left(\vec{v}_{1} t+\vec{\eta}\right) e^{-2 t}$ for non-zero vectors $\vec{v}_{1}$ and $\vec{\eta}$.

Problem 2 [24 points]:
Each of the following problems is worth 8 points.
2a) [8] Find the solution of

$$
y^{\prime}=\frac{y^{2}}{(x+2)^{2}}, \quad y(0)=\frac{2}{3}
$$

2b) [8] Find the solution of

$$
y^{\prime}-\frac{4}{x} y=x^{5} e^{x}, \quad y(1)=2
$$

2c) [8] Find the general solution of

$$
y^{\prime \prime}-4 y=t
$$

Problem 3 [12 points]:
Consider the forced spring-mass system

$$
y^{\prime \prime}+y^{\prime}+y=\cos (\omega t)
$$

for a forcing frequency $\omega>0$.
a) [6] Find the forced response (the steady-state solution) of the system (in terms of $\omega$ ).
b) [3] Find the amplitude of the forced response.
c) [3] Determine the frequency $\omega$, for which the forced response has the largest amplitude.

\frac{d \vec{x}}{d t}=\left[\begin{array}{cc}
2 & 8 \\
-1 & -2
\end{array}\right] \vec{x}, \quad \vec{x}(0)=\left[\begin{array}{c}

\end{array}\right] .
$$

Problem 6 [10 points]:
For each of the following two-dimensional systems of differential equations identify the corresponding phase portrait given on the next page by writing clearly the appropriate letter ( $\mathbf{A}-\mathbf{I}$ ) in the empty box. It is not necessary to solve the systems of differential equations. Each answer is worth 2 points, no partial credits will be given.
i) $\left[\begin{array}{l}x^{\prime} \\ y^{\prime}\end{array}\right]=\left[\begin{array}{cc}2 & -5 \\ 6 & 1\end{array}\right]\left[\begin{array}{l}x \\ y\end{array}\right]$

ii) $\left[\begin{array}{l}x^{\prime} \\ y^{\prime}\end{array}\right]=\left[\begin{array}{cc}-1 & -4 \\ -5 & 0\end{array}\right]\left[\begin{array}{l}x \\ y\end{array}\right]$ $\square$
iii) $\left[\begin{array}{l}x^{\prime} \\ y^{\prime}\end{array}\right]=\left[\begin{array}{ll}5 & 3 \\ 3 & 5\end{array}\right]\left[\begin{array}{l}x \\ y\end{array}\right]$ $\square$
iv) $\left[\begin{array}{l}x^{\prime} \\ y^{\prime}\end{array}\right]=\left[\begin{array}{cc}1 & 3 \\ -2 & -6\end{array}\right]\left[\begin{array}{l}x \\ y\end{array}\right]$ $\square$
v) $\left[\begin{array}{l}x^{\prime} \\ y^{\prime}\end{array}\right]=\left[\begin{array}{cc}3 & -1 \\ 1 & 1\end{array}\right]\left[\begin{array}{l}x \\ y\end{array}\right]$ $\square$
